1. Course Title

Myanmar-Thailand Higher Education Institutions Leadership and Networking Programme

2. Duration

2 weeks (one week in Thailand and one week in Myanmar).

3. Background and Rationale

Thailand and Myanmar are close neighbours and have established longstanding relationships. In recent years, the relationships have been deepened and expanded to cover various areas including education, besides economic, trade and investment.

In terms of education, the Myanmar government has made the reform of the entire higher education system a national priority, recognizing that human capital development is a major driving force to the success of the comprehensive sustainable development goals of the country. Since the year 2014, budget for educational development has been significantly enlarged accounting for more than 5 percent of the total government expenditure to support the education reform (Oxford Business Group, 2016). The policy dialogue “Empowering Higher Education - A Vision for Myanmar's Universities”, held on June 29–30, 2013 in Nay Pyi Taw, attended by Chair of Higher Education Law and Yangon University Revitalization Committees and, at that time, the leader of Burma's National League for Democracy, Aung San Suu Kyi had reached the conclusion that the higher educational reform should aim at decentralize universities, increase inclusivity and equity of universities, and increase international connectivity.

However, to successfully achieve educational reform's targets of Myanmar especially the decentralization of the university's management, leadership skills of top university's management is a key. On the other hand, Thai HEIs, against the backdrop of the rapid changes namely globalization 2.0 with ASEAN centrality, population structural changes, digitization era, Internet of Things, environmental crisis and global warming, are seeking to internationalize and collaborate with their regional partners.

In response to the needs for human capacity development and to foster academic partnership between Myanmar and Thai higher education institutions, Mae Fah Luang University and the Office of Higher Education Commission, Ministry of Education, Thailand design this training programme focusing on developing the leadership skills and exchanges of good practices between higher education institution between Thailand and Myanmar.

On completing the programme, participants will be equipped with knowledge and skills from strategically plan for university development, implementation of the plan, human resources development, financial management, internationalisation and monitoring and evaluation process that is suitable for their own institutional and fast changing global contexts. The participants would also have abundant of opportunity to foster network among participating universities and plan for future collaborating activities benefiting both Thailand and Myanmar.

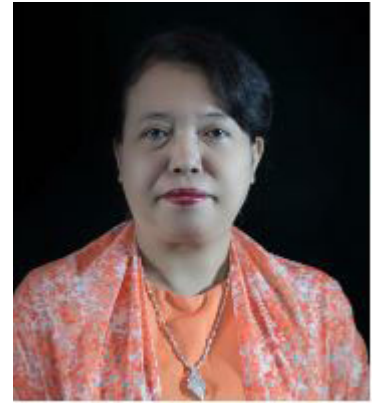
